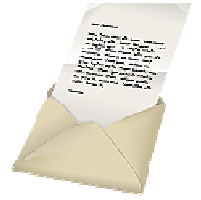

Highest Word Score

Highest Team Score

5595 by Bournemouth Magpies in their match against Salisbury.
